### CAPABILITY MATURITY MODEL INTEGRATION (CMMI) SUPPORT

#### 1.0 SCOPE

Naval Surface Warfare Center, Panama City (NSWC-PC) is a prominent DON research and development (R&D) laboratory, with numerous projects involving development and testing of Command, Control, Communications, Computers and Information (C4I) hardware and software systems. In order to become more competitive in the R&D market place, NSWC-PC has been standardizing its management and development processes over the past several years. Previous efforts were based on the Capability Maturity Model. The Software Engineering Institute (SEI) is a federally funded R&D center sponsored by DOD and operated by Carnegie Mellon University. A new model has been developed by SEI and NSWC-PC intends to pursue improvements using this model, Capability Maturity Model Integration (CMMI).

Process improvement has proven to increase product and service quality as organizations apply it to achieve their business objectives. Today, the CMMI Product Suite is at the forefront of process improvement by providing the latest best practices for product and service development and maintenance. The CMMI models improve upon the best practices of previous models. There are multiple CMMI models available. NSWC-PC needs contractor support from subject matter experts (SMEs) to decide which CMMI model best fits its process improvement needs and how to implement it.

#### 2.0 APPLICABLE DOCUMENTS

The following documents, of the exact issue shown, form a part of this SOW to the extent specified herein. NSWC-PC Division R60 is working towards attaining CMMI Level 3 certification. SME support is required to review current documentation and determine how R60 needs to proceed. ##### 3.1 TASK # 1 – PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT

The contractor shall explain the formal CMMI appraisal process, review NSWC-PC documentation and identify all CMMI program requirements that need to be implemented to reach Level 3. The contractor shall provide examples/scenarios that will help the TPOC and her associates understand what is expected and how to implement the CMMI program.

The contractor shall provide a letter report in contractor format within 5 days after the visit summarizing his findings and recommendations. Letter report shall provide, as a minimum, a bulletized list of the CMMI program requirements that need to be implemented to reach Level 3, and brief summaries of the more significant examples/scenarios presented to the TPOC above.

##### 3.2 TRAVEL

One trip to Panama City for 2 people for 3 days is required to support this task

#### 4.0 GOVERNMENT FURNISHED INFORMATION
